23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Entrance Antiphon: "You are just, O Lord, and your judgment is right; treat your servant in accord with your merciful love." Ps 119 (118): 137, 124

Communion Antiphon: "Like the deer that yearns for running streams, so my soul is yearning for you, my God; my soul is thirsting for God, the living God." Ps 42 (41): 2-3

Reflection for this Sunday: This 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time calls us to a deeper reflection on what it truly means to be a disciple of Christ. The Scriptures remind us first of our need for God's wisdom, for our human understanding is often limited and clouded. Without God's light, we stumble in the dark, but with His guidance, we can discern His plan and walk in peace. St. Paul, in his letter to Philemon, challenges us to see one another no longer through the eyes of division or social status, but as brothers and sisters in Christ—welcoming all with love, compassion, and respect. The Gospel brings us to the heart of discipleship, where Jesus tells us that to follow Him requires sacrifice: nothing—neither family, possessions, nor personal comfort—can come before Him. Carrying our cross is not simply enduring hardship, but choosing to live in total commitment to God's will, even when it is costly. This week, we also rejoice in the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary on September 8. Her life is a beautiful witness of complete surrender to God's plan, showing us that true discipleship begins with a humble and trusting "yes" to the Lord. Mary's birth brought hope into the world, for through her, the Savior came to us. In addition, the Church prepares to celebrate a moment of great joy on September 7, when Pope Leo XIV will canonize Blessed Carlo Acutis and Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati together. Carlo, a modern teenager devoted to the Eucharist, and Pier Giorgio, a young man known for his charity and joyful faith, are shining examples of how holiness is possible in every age. Their canonization reminds us that sanctity is not reserved for the few but is a calling for each of us in our daily lives. As we reflect on this Sunday's message, the nativity of Our Lady, and the witness of these new saints, we are encouraged to place God above all else, to welcome others as members of His family, and to walk with courage and love along the sometimes difficult path of discipleship. With Mary's intercession and the example of Carlo and Pier Giorgio, may we learn to live our faith with joy, sacrifice, and unwavering trust in the Lord.

Pope's Intention for the Month of September: "For our relationship with all of creation." Let us pray that, inspired by Saint Francis, we might experience our interdependence with all creatures who are loved by God and worthy of love and respect.
